The Boise River Greenbelt is a park that stretches 25 miles along the banks of the Boise River. With its tree-lined path that goes through the heart of Boise and offers wildlife and scenic views, it is a popular and much loved park. In addition to walking trails, there is a ten-mile self-directed bike ride or hike that includes a scavenger hunt related to the history of the city. Located between Municipal Park and the Boise Greenbelt. The Center is not obvious from the road; it is situated behind the Fish and Game Headquarters building on Walnut Street.

The Idaho Fish and Game MK Nature Center offers a unique wildlife experience on a 4.6-acre site along the Boise River Greenbelt. The StreamWalk and Visitor Center provide a glimpse of Idaho's many landscapes and abundant wildlife. Underwater viewing windows along the stream walk give visitors a fish-eye view of the world.

Float the Boise River

The Barber to Ann Morrison Park float is so simple that even a child could do it, and as many as 100,000 people float the river each year. The Boise River itself is a tributary of the Snake River, approximately 75 mi (120 km) long. During the summer, the Boise River becomes a gentle ride through downtown Boise, going through the greenbelt recreation area and passing many of the city's great parks. Visit Barber Park to start your visit. If you are new to floating, then everything you need (save your clothes and some cash) are available at the park. Check out the website to get the lowdown on rentals and shuttles. Floating the river is free. Rentals and shuttles cost extra.
